Course Description

This course is the second semester of the second-year Japanese. The goal of this course is to develop further proficiency in the four language skills – listening, speaking, reading, and writing, and necessary cultural knowledge – moving from the beginning level towards the intermediate level. Prerequisite: JAPN 002A with a grade of a C- or better. 4 units. Spring semester.

Course Objectives (Student Learning Outcomes in Japanese)

At the end of the course, students will be able to:

- Use transitive verbs and intransitive verbs appropriately
- Express regrets over what you should not have done
- Use honorific, modest, and humble expressions in a formal context
- Express gratitude in a culturally appropriate way
- Make requests and proposals modestly
- Ask for and give directions
- Talk about unpleasant experiences or events using passive sentences
- Tell somebody what you wish him/her to do
- Talk about childhood experiences using causative sentences
- Express opinions on social or cultural issues
- Give and receive advice in a culturally appropriate way
- Talk about unpleasant experiences using causative-passive sentences
- Convey your intentions in a culturally appropriate way
- Ask and explain how to do things the right way
- Scan for the general meaning in authentic or semi-authentic materials including superstitions, "Rakugo" (Japanese comic monologue)
- Read and write about various topics in Japanese (such as college life, cultural differences between Japan and the U.S., and personal experiences)
- Read and write a journal, a formal letter, and a casual email in Japanese
- Recognize, read, and write 93 Kanji characters (a total of 317 Kanji in JAPN 1A, 1B, 2A and 2B)

Method of Instruction

This course is conducted in Japanese. The method of instruction includes lectures, presentations, visual media, paired work, class and small group discussions, online cultural discussions, and reading semi-authentic/authentic materials. In Japanese 2B, Lesson 18 to Lesson 23 will be taught, and approximately 8 to 9 days will be spent on each lesson.

Online Component

The information, grades and materials related to this course will be posted on SacCT (http://online.csus.edu/). It is expected that you will log onto SacCT on a daily basis including Fridays, and work on online assignments. It is your responsibility to follow the daily schedule, study and review these materials.

Course Assignments and Projects

1. One-Minute Speech (5%)

At the beginning of class, you will be asked to give a one-minute **memorized** speech in front of the class. Any topic can be chosen; however, make an appointment with the instructor during the office hours a week before your assigned day to practice reading aloud your speech. The grading criteria is based on 1) presentation skills, 2) fluency, 3) content, and 4) accuracy.

2. Model Conversation Performance (10%)

In each lesson, you will be asked to create/memorize a dialogue using the target grammar with your partner, and perform in class. The detailed instruction will follow. The grading criteria is as follows:

5 points	Excellent use of the target grammar, excellent fluency, pronunciation,
	intonation, and cultural and social appropriateness
4 points	Clearly prepared and fair performance, but weak in minor areas
3 points	The target grammar was not used properly
2 points	The target grammar was not used properly and not memorized
1 points	Present, but evidently unprepared
0 point	Absent, or no performance

3. Written Quizzes and Online Quizzes (20%)

In each lesson, you will be given five written quizzes in class (two on vocabulary, two on Kanji, and one on grammar). The quiz will be given at the beginning of the class, and no extra time will be given for those who came late for class. In addition, three or four online quizzes will be given on SacCT for each lesson. It is your responsibility to complete the online exercises during the assigned period. Two lowest quiz scores will be omitted at the end of the semester.

NOTE: If you miss a quiz due to a tardy or unexcused absence, your score will be zero. Make-up quizzes will be given only when you email the instructor and/or submit written proof that explains your excused absence. Please take the make-up quiz on the day you return from the excused absence.

4. Homework Assignments (15%)

Homework consists of workbook, reading and writing assignments. Homework will be collected at the beginning of the class. The homework that was completed during the class or late/incomplete homework will not receive credit unless you had an excused absence. Homework assignments from the workbook are worth 10 points each. However, reading and writing assignments are worth 20 points each. If you need help completing the assignments, work with the instructor and tutors.

5. Exams (30%)

There will be two examinations:

Midterm Exam: Lessons 18-20 (15%) Final Exam: Lessons 18-20 (review) & Lessons 21-23 (15%) Each exam consists of the following sections: listening, grammar, writing, reading, oral performance and culture. There is no make-up exam unless you have special circumstances. Consult with the instructor in advance if you cannot take the exam on the assigned day.

6. Final Skit Presentation (10%)

At the end of this semester, you will create a skit presentation (5 minutes) with your partner, utilizing what has been taught in this course. The use of drawings, photos, handouts, or other visuals is encouraged. Consult with the instructor about your skit before your presentation. More detailed information will follow.
